Oklahoma City, Site of the 2021 Reunion

OKLAHOMA

Although it is one of the newest states in the union, Oklahoma has one of the oldest records of human occupation. Its abundant resources attracted early hunting and gathering peoples by about 9500 BC. Beginning about 700 BC people in what is now eastern Oklahoma developed a variety of exquisite pottery, textiles, sculpture and metalware.

The expedition of Francisco Vázquez de Coronado in 1541 claimed the area for Spain. In 1714 Louis Juchereau de Saint-Denis visited Oklahoma and other Frenchmen subsequently followed establishing a fur trade with Native Americans. France and Spain struggled for control until 1763, leaving only the natives to contest Spanish authority until the return of the French flag in 1800. Three years later, the United States acquired most of Oklahoma through the Louisiana Purchase. The region, as one of the purchase's most attractive parts might well have become one of the first states but in fact it was one of the last. Because of pressure to remove Native Americans from the settled east, in 1828 the US Congress reserved Oklahoma for Native Americans and required all other to withdraw. By 1880 more than 60 tribes from, other areas of the country – in the 1830's the Creek, Cherokee, and Choctaw, and in the 1870's such Plains Indians as the Cheyenne, Arapaho, Kiowa, and Comanche – had been forcibly removed to Indian Territory where they joined local groups including the Wichita and Kansa. Later as the country expanded westward, pressure grew to open the territory to settlers of European ancestry. By 1879 organized bands, who became known as "Boomers" so named because of an economic boom were moving in despite Federal law. Pressure continued until Congress opened some 3,100 square miles of western Indian Territory bringing on a famous land run that began with a signal from a cavalry bugle. Known as Oklahoma Territory, the new area came to include about half the former Indian domain. Then the settlers, many of whom earned the name "Sooner" for entering the area before receiving official permission, sought statehood which was granted in 1907.

Later devasted by the Dust Bowl, the Sooner State parlayed "bubblin crude" beneath its red soil into modern prosperity.

Little Known Facts

- The supermarket shopping cart, the parking meter, the electric guitar and the yield sign were all invented in Oklahoma.
- With more than 200 reservoirs, Oklahoma boasts more man-made lakes than any other state.
- Oklahoma is home to 38 federally recognized Indian tribal nations, more than any other state except California.
- Hugo, Oklahoma was once served as the winter quarters for numerous circus acts. Many bygone performers are buried in the town's Showman's Rest cemetery. Hugo is located in the southeast corner of Oklahoma near the border with Texas. Hugo was named for the French novelist Victor Hugo
- Claremore, Oklahoma in the northeast part of the state near Tulsa was the birthplace of Will Rogers. He was actually born on a ranch near Oologah which is nearby but always claimed to be from Claremore "because nobody but an Indian can pronounce 'Oologah'". It also is celebrated as the town where Rodgers and Hammerstein set the musical Oklahoma!

Greetings to all,

I sincerely hope that this message finds everyone in good health, both physically and emotionally. It's been a very unusual spring and summer. This is normally the message where I'd be reminiscing about our recent reunion, but not this fall. The COVID19 pandemic has changed the plans of ours and many other veterans' associations. Our 2020 reunion was cancelled and is rescheduled for 2022. The June 2020 letter that was issued for the cancellation and the March 2020 letter about the status of the reunion at that time, can both be found in this issue. Needless to say, the cancellation was a very hard decision for the Directors to make.

The 2021 reunion remains on schedule for September 29th – October 3rd in Oklahoma City, OK. Our reunion hotel will be the Sheraton Oklahoma

City Downtown Hotel. The Sheraton is located in downtown OKC, a few blocks from the popular Bricktown entertainment area. This area is similar to San Antonio's Riverwalk area, with many restaurants, lounges, craft breweries, bars, shops, a water taxi and other attractions. The complete reunion information package will be in the 2021 Spring issue.

With the cancellation of the 2020 reunion, we also had to cancel our elections. We will be holding our elections at the 2021 reunion in Oklahoma City. The term of office for those elected next year will be for three years so that our election year will be back in sync with our ship reunions. Our By-Laws require anyone wishing to be nominated for an office to be in attendance at the general meeting where the nominations and elections take place. The memorial service in OKC will include the names of all our Shipmates who have passed since the memorial service in San Diego. Unfortunately, it will be a long list as we lose many of our older members every year.

It's been a very tough year for the Battleship New Jersey. The ship was closed when the State of New Jersey shut down in March to help control the spread of the COVID19 virus. When it did reopen, the attendance was much lower than normal. The Battleship New Jersey's Board of Trustees made the decision to close the ship after Labor Day and reopen in the Spring of 2021. (UPDATE: The State of New Jersey has reinstated a \$1,000,000 in direct state aid for the Battleship New Jersey in the state budget that was just signed by the Governor. The Battleship will be reopening on October 3rd.)

As we have done for many years, the USS New Jersey Veterans, Inc. once again offered three \$1000 scholarships to high school seniors from the Class of 2020. Unfortunately, we received no applications for the 2020 scholarship awards. The scholarships are open to all graduating high school seniors whose father, or grandfather, served on the New Jersey and are current members of our organization. Please encourage your child or grandchild to apply next year.

I hope the virus will be well under control and behind us by this time next year. We all will miss our week together this Fall. Please stay safe and healthy till we gather in Oklahoma City.

TREASURER'S REPORT

It was extremely disappointing that we were forced to cancel this year's reunion especially since it was scheduled on the ship. We can look forward to another ship visit in 2022.

Our fiscal year ends December 31st so interim financial discussions should take into consideration that the numbers will change rather significantly by year end.

During 2020 through September 30th we have received total net funds of \$5,101 and have disbursed a total of \$11,334 leaving us with \$32,054 in bank balances. By way of comparison, on September 30, 2019 we had \$35,465 in bank balances.



Major disbursements year to date in 2020 were the Jersey Bounce expenses, 2021 Reunion expenses and Ship's Store inventory purchases. Our major source of revenue are the annual dues which are not billed until the fourth quarter. The fourth quarter also includes this edition of the Bounce which is the major expense of the quarter.

The Spring 2021 Bounce will have the complete annual financial report.

If there any questions concerning the financials, please contact me and I will try and address them.

Hopefully we can all meet again next year in Oklahoma City which promises to be an excellent reunion venue.

We are all deeply saddened by the passing of our friend and shipmate, Bill Myers. Bill passed away on October 6, 2020, as a result of complications due to COVID19. He is survived by his loving wife Rebecca Greer Myers, his daughters, Stephanie and Barbara, brothers, Robert and David, and many grandchildren, great grandchildren, family and friends. He was preceded to our Lord by his first wife, Mary.

Bill joined the US Navy just one month after graduating from high school in 1966. He attended boot camp and Electricians Mate 'A' school in San Diego and was then assigned to his first ship, a minesweeper, out of Charleston, SC. Subject: Cancellation of 2020 Reunion

To all Members,

On Sunday, June 7th, the Board of Directors met via an online Zoom meeting to evaluate the current situation. The result of our meeting was a unanimous vote to cancel and reschedule the 2020 USS New Jersey Veterans Reunion. This was not an easy decision. We discussed a number of options and weighed the pros and cons of holding our reunion this year. The safety and well-being of our membership was our primary concern. We determined that there are just too many unknowns as to what the conditions will be like in September.

The classification of the COVID19 pandemic as a national emergency enabled us to cancel all the 2020 reunion contracts, with no financial damages to the organization. Anyone who has already mailed your registration form for the reunion events will receive a refund in the mail soon. Anyone who has made hotel reservations at the Crowne Plaza should cancel them.

My hope was to just move both upcoming reunions, 2020 and 2021, ahead one year to 2021 and 2022, respectively. The 2021 reunion is scheduled for Oklahoma City at the end of September. I contacted the OKC hotel and discussed our options. They do not look at the postponement, of an event scheduled for 15 months from now, as being a result of the current national emergency. Rescheduling the OKC reunion would require us to pay a non-refundable change of date fee and there would also be an increase to our nightly room rate. As a result of this, the decision was made to hold our 2021 reunion in OKC, as scheduled, and then reschedule 2020 to 2022, back in the Philadelphia area. We know everyone looks forward to visiting the ship and we wanted to offer that event as soon as possible. We will vote on a location for 2023 at the OKC reunion, and to get our reunions back on our required schedule, the 2024 reunion will be in the Philadelphia area, where it would have been before the COVID19 pandemic upset our plans.

The Election of Officers, scheduled for this year, will take place at the 2021 reunion in OKC. All current Directors have agreed to stay on until that election. The term of those elected in 2021 will be for 3 years and the elections will return to their normal 4-year cycle at the 2024 general meeting.

It's been a rough year for the museum. Last year we did really well. We opened new spaces, expanded the tour route, as well as our program offerings. For the first time in recent memory we were open throughout the winter this year, hoping to break 100,000. Obviously that dream is well behind us. In mid-March we closed when the state shut down. We were able to reopen in mid-June but saw only 10% of last year's visitation over the summer. We have not been able to host events or overnights and those two programs account for much of our operating budget.

In a normal year the state also gives the ship funding, but this year it was vetoed from the budget. As a result, the museum again closed on Labor Day as we went into the slow season and laid off all but a handful of staff including myself. Fortunately, our executive director and board were able to work with the state to ensure we got some money when the budget was eventually passed. Right now, the museum has brought back some staff, is only open on weekends, and is only selling tickets from 1100-1500. After New Years the ship will again close until the Spring like we have in years past. Next year economists are only predicting museums to see 85% of the visitation they did in 2019 and it is unclear if we will be able to host events or overnights.

So how does the museum cater to our audience when most people can't come out the ship? That's where our various digital learning programs come in, in particular our YouTube channel. We started consistently creating YouTube videos about two years ago but when the museum closed in March we went from filming once a week to nearly one every day. The videos fall into several different categories but in general they include information about naval battles, interviews with veterans, how other battleships compare to us, show spaces on the ship not on the tour route, or show how to use shipboard equipment. In one video I tried on an OBA, in another I went from the bilge all the way to the TACAN antenna on top of the mast. My favorite video was where I got to crawl all the way down a 16" gun barrel.



OKLAHOMA CITY SIGHTS






BRICKTOWN





The Vietnam Gallantry Cross



Did you serve on the USS New Jersey while we were deployed off the coast of Vietnam? If you did, you know that we all received our Vietnam Service medal and our Vietnam Campaign medal. We proudly wore our National Defense ribbon along with these two Vietnam ribbons when we returned to Subic Bay after our first time on the gun line. For those who don't know, there is a third Vietnam ribbon that we were awarded. That medal/ribbon is the Vietnam Cross of Gallantry with the Palm device (VCoG). The USS New Jersey was awarded this unit award by the government of South Vietnam. I never knew about this award, but I'm sure many of you did. It is not on my DD214 because, like the Vietnam Campaign medal, it is an award by a foreign nation. The DD214 does not list foreign awards. I did notice that Captain Snyder's photos includes this ribbon with his ribbons on his uniform. Surprisingly, it appears that Captain Snyder's only Vietnam deployment was as Commanding Officer of the USS New Jersey.

In 1974, former President Nguyen Van Thieu and Congress of South Vietnam awarded the VCoG to all Americans, and other non-Vietnamese nationalities who also served in Vietnam, as an individual award with respect and in gratitude for sacrificial and valorous service trying to protect and preserve the Republic of South Vietnam from communist aggression. Prior to that, the VCoG was primarily a unit award such, as the award to the USS New Jersey BB62. The ribbons shown on the side of the ship's superstructure includes the unit awarded ribbon with the Palm device and in gold frame.

All this means that if you served on the Battleship New Jersey while she was off the coast of South and North Vietnam, you can add this medal and ribbon to your memorabilia wall. Redo your shadow box and include the Vietnam Cross of Gallantry.
