### TREASURER'S REPORT

We had another wonderful Reunion on Board the ship. We also elected seven new Directors and Advisors to the managment team. They bring a new range of experence and background to the organization.

Financially the organization continues to do well. Traditionally we have had to subsidize the costs of the reunion and while this year was no different, the subsidy was significantly less than normal. With only one exception, over the past ten reunions the membership has had to contribute an average of about \$4,700 to each reunion. While all the expenses for this year's reunion have not been paid yet, the subsidy will be in the range of a few hundred dollars, not thousands. Dave and Bob did a great job in pricing events and the introduction of Registration Fees helped significantly reduce the deficit



Another very positive result of this year's reunion was the outcome of the Scholarship Auction where we raised over \$7,000 for the Scholarship Fund.

We ended the month of September with \$47,669 in cash balances, a \$7,930 increase over our year-end position. For the remainer of the fiscal year we have the costs of this edition of the Bounce to disburse, but we also have the Membership Dues renewal revenue to receive.

I would welcome any questions members might have regarding the financial status of the organization.

Concerning the Bounce, I would like to make sure that we especially recognize Bill Romer who provided an excellent portfolio of pictures for us to use in this edition of the Bounce.

I hope everyone has a safe and healthy winter ahead.

Treasurer Report: Phil Tasker reported things are going well. Available funds are \$39,163.72, restricted funds \$12,613.50 Note: Restricted funds are the funds such as scholarship fund, donations to ship. Requirements as outlined by Congress:

The Commemoration honors everyone who served on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces from November 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975. All were called to serve, none could self-determine where they were stationed, and all were seen in the same way by a country that could not separate the war from the warrior. Each person who served during this period earned and rightly deserves our profound thanks.

#### Eligibility:

Presented to living U.S. veterans who served on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces at any time during the period of November 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975, regardless of location, are eligible to receive one lapel pin.

#### Symbolism:

- Eagle The eagle represents courage, honor, and dedicated service to our Nation. As one of the most recognizable and notable American symbols, it is emblazoned on numerous military insignia.
- Blue Circle The color blue matches the canton of the American flag and signifies vigilance, perseverance, and justice.
- · Laurel Wreath A time-honored symbol representing honor and victory.
- Stripes The stripes behind the eagle represent the American flag.
- Stars The six stars represent the six allies who served, sacrificed, and fought alongside one another: the Commonwealth of Australia, the Kingdom of Thailand, New Zealand, the Republic of Korea and the Republic of the Philippines.
- Message "A Grateful Nation Thanks and Honors You" is embossed on the back, closest to the heart of the wearer. The official name of the Commemoration is included to remind each veteran that this is a national initiative.

## **State of the Museum Report**

Shipmates,

It has been an incredibly busy year. It was great to see many of you at the commissioning of the new *Virginia*-class submarine USS *New Jersey* (SSN-796). She is now the third warship to carry the state's name. It was also great to see you all in September at the crew reunion when you got to see some of the major projects we have recently completed. I'm happy to say we have knocked out two more big ones since then.

Our focus during the first half of the year of course was drydocking the ship. Around 6,200 guests supported the project by paying for tours of the drydock while the ship was being repainted. During that project we applied a new system of coatings to the underwater part of the hull which is expected to last 30 years in the freshwater environment we are berthed in. We replaced the more than 1,200 anodes that made up the passive cathodic protection of the ship and we tested all of the cofferdams over the roughly 160 through-hull openings. We had to repair about 10% of them which had failed. Thanks to the massive amount of support, we received we were also able to extend our time on the blocks and make additional repairs to thin parts of the hull, around rivetted seams, and at the gland seals for the propellor shafts. Thanks to your support and the support of all the folks who came out for tours this project was even more successful than we originally planned.

After spending nearly \$10 million in drydock on exclusively projects underwater on the exterior of the ship we were nervous people wouldn't realize we had done any work, so we scheduled several other capital projects to coincide with drydocking. Shortly after getting back to Camden, we finished redecking the main deck finally making it safe for guests to make a full lap of the deck. Work will continue redecking the superstructure for at least another year, assuming we continue to get funding. We also just finished repainting the entire freeboard. It was cheaper to do pier side from a barge than while we were in the yard, and it had been over a decade since we last did that.

The final part of the project was reattaching the mast and various antennas we removed to safely transit under the Walt Whitman bridge on our way to the yard. It didn't sit right with any of us here at the museum that we would be paying to "damage" and then "fix" the ship, so we agreed from the beginning that we were going to make an effort to add things back onto the ship as part of this project. I am happy to report that in addition to repainting the pieces while they were on the pier we also replaced one nonfunctioning antenna with a new one, fixed 3 of the tangled or broken halyards and, oh yeah, added back our drone control dome and long missing port side harpoon launch tubes!

The fiberglass dome that is supposed to sit on the forward face of the aft stack that protected the RPV drone control antenna was not there while the ship was mothballed. It's the same dome as the SPQ-9 fire control domes on the Ticonderoga-class cruisers in the reserve basin at the Philadelphia Navy Yard where we were drydocked. However, the Navy would not let us bring in a crane to remove any. Fortunately, Infinite Technologies Radomes and Composite Structures (ITIRCS) reached out to us and said they make a similar sized dome. They manufactured and shipped it to the museum for free.

The Navy couldn't let us send men aloft to get the dome but when we reached out about completing our armament they didn't let us down. The museum was able to get eight Harpoon launch tubes for the starboard side of the ship years ago, but we had never been able to get any for the less viewed river side. Naval Weapons Station Yorktown had some they were about to dispose of, and we were able to drive down the day before the crane was available to pick them up.

We were able to save a bunch of money by installing both the dome and the Harpoons while the crane was here to reattach the mast and antennas. *New Jersey* is now the only *Iowa* with a complete set of real weapons. (*Iowa* has replica harpoons and phalanx's, *Missouri* and *Wisconsin* don't have a complete set yet.) And yes, we did get the SPS-49 air search radar antenna spinning again when we reattached it.



## State of the Museum Report

We have intentionally been working towards getting these projects done this year because next year is the 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of the Navy and Marine Corps. Both were formed right here in the Philadelphia area and so the Navy has chosen our area as the place to celebrate. In October 2025 there will be a Fleet Week including at least four active-duty warships in Camden and Philadelphia which will then lead into the national 250<sup>th</sup> celebration in 2026, which is also happening in the Philadelphia area.

And while our area is seeing record breaking numbers of tourists coming to celebrate those huge anniversaries the battleship will look better than she has since before she was decommissioned. Her bottom is clean and watertight, her freeboard and much of her superstructure has been painted in the last year, her main deck is completely redecked, and she is more complete than ever with the addition of the new Harpoon tubes and radome. Thank you for all your support. That what let us do these projects. Hopefully we will see you back on board before we host the 2027 crew reunion on board.



The aftermath of what was likely the heaviest shore bombardment by a single ship the world will ever see.

In the early morning of 22 February 1969, a radio call from a Marine outpost just south of the so-called "demilitarized zone" in Vietnam calmly but urgently requested assistance. Steaming in the dark waters of the South China Sea was a giant of a ship, the USS New Jersey (BB-62). She was the Navy's only battleship, resurrected from the mothball fleet less than a year before. Together with a Coast Guard cutter, the behemoth answered the plea for assistance by opening up with her portside 5-inch guns and then followed with salvoes from her main 16-inch battery. Radarman Third Class Bob Fulks could hear the staccato bursts of machine-gun fire on the radio as he coordinated with spotter Lance Corporal Roger Clouse to rain death and destruction onto a large number of enemy troops who were closing in on the embattled Marines.

The initial rounds landed very close to the Marines' position, because that was where the enemy was. As Fire Controlman Rick Crawford watched the plot of cascading rounds develop, they formed an almost perfect circle, painting a harrowing image that showed the Marines were completely surrounded. Sailors and Marines worked together for hours to fight off the threatening force, their young voices speaking calmly by radio in the midst of great chaos and impending catastrophe. Round after round erupted from barrels that grew hotter and hotter until the grease on the guns' recoil slides began to bubble. As the battle wore on, the diameter of the plotted circle began to expand, presenting a reassuring image of gradual enemy withdrawal. Finally, after five-and-a-half hours and nearly 2,000 rounds, the enemy broke contact and withdrew.
