J. Edward Snyder

Rear Admiral J. Snyder was Captain of the USS New Jersey during its service in the Vietnam War. He was born on October 23, 1924 in Grand Forks, North Dakota the son of a Methodist minister. He graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1944. He also attended the Naval War College and later earned a M.S. in nuclear physics from MIT in 1965.

After a tour of sea duty, he was placed in charge of a technical group assessing blast and radiation damage from the Bikini Atoll nuclear tests. He subsequently held several other technical positions evaluating fire control and weapons systems. He also served as a research assistant and scientific staff member at Los Alamos Scientific Laboratories.

He later returned to sea as commander of a destroyer. In 1963 he became a special assistant to the Assistant Secretary of the Navy (R&D) with responsibilities for matters relating to ballistic missiles.

When the USS New Jersey was activated Captain Ed Snyder became her designated captain and was assigned to finish taking her out of mothballs, ready her for deployment, and take her into battle off Vietnam.

After leaving the New Jersey as she was designated for decommissioning, her served as chief of staff to the commander of the Cruiser Destroyer Force, Atlantic Fleet and then was promoted to Rear Admiral. He was appointed Oceanographer of the Navy in 1971, a position he held until his retirement in 1979.

On the following page is the financial statement for 2019. We began 2019 with total bank balances of \$37,208 and finished the year with \$38,287 in the bank. At year end those balances included \$3,238 in the Scholarship fund and \$160 in membership donation to the Ship Restoration Fund leaving \$34,889 in unrestricted operating funds.

During 2019 our membership donated \$5,170 towards restoration efforts. During the past four years membership has contributed \$21,964 towards restoring the ship and improving the overall appearance.

As Liaison director I have a data base of all who have served on the USS New Jersey by era's, I continue to add shipmates who are found and were not in the list.



National September 11 Memorial and Museum Tour

We all remember where we were on September 11, 2001. The 9/11 Memorial & Museum is the country's principal institution concerned with exploring 9/11, documenting its impact, and examining its continuing significance.

The National September 11 Memorial

Experience the National September 11 Memorial, a tribute of remembrance and honor to the nearly 3,000 people killed in the terror attacks of September 11, 2001 at the World Trade Center site, near Shanksville, Pa., and at the Pentagon, as well as the six people killed in the World Trade Center bombing in February 1993. The Memorial's twin reflecting pools are each nearly an acre in size and feature the largest manmade waterfalls in the North America. The pools sit within the footprints where the Twin Towers once stood. The names of



every person who died in the 2001 and 1993 attacks are inscribed into bronze panels edging the Memorial pools, a powerful reminder of the largest loss of life resulting from a foreign attack on American soil and the greatest single loss of rescue personnel in

American history.



The National September 11 Museum

The National September 11 Memorial Museum serves as the country's principal institution for examining the implications of the events of 9/11, documenting the impact of those events, and exploring the continuing significance of September 11, 2001. The Museum's 110,000 square feet of exhibition space is located within the archaeological heart of the World Trade Center site - telling the story

of 9/11 through multimedia displays, archives, narratives, and a collection of monumental

and authentic artifacts. The lives of every victim of the 2001 and 1993 attacks are commemorated and visitors have the opportunity to learn about the men, women, and children who died. The monumental artifacts of the Museum provide a link to the events of 9/11, while presenting intimate, stories of loss, compassion, reckoning, and recovery that are central to telling the story of the attacks and the aftermath.

National September 11 Memorial and Museum Tour

The cost is \$100.00 per person. (includes transportation, museum admission and early dinner)

It will be a long day, but we believe it's a very special tour that will provide you with the ability to visit the National September 11 Memorial and Museum without having to deal with the hassle and high cost of visiting New York City on your own. We will provide water and snacks on the buses. Depending on the number of people we have, the Museum may have us split into two groups.

Here is the tentative schedule provided by the tour company.

- Deluxe motor coach arrives at hotel at 0700. Buses depart at 0730 for NYC.
- Arrive at the 9-11 Museum around 1015.
- The first group will enter the Museum at 1030 (3 hours in Museum)
- The second group will visit the Memorial grounds outside the Museum.
- The second group will enter the Museum at 1100 (3 hours in Museum)
- The first group to exit the Museum at 1310 and visit the outside Memorial Grounds
- The second group and the first group to meet at 1400 for departure to restaurant.
- Early plated dinner at Mastoris Restaurant in Bordentown, NJ.
- The group will arrive back at the hotel around 1845.







Douglas Jeffery Katz

Vice Admiral Douglas was recruited to play football at the Naval Academy. He graduated and received his commission in June 1965. Admiral Katz later received a M.S. degree in Management from the Naval Postgraduate School and is also a graduate of the Naval War College Command and Staff course.

Admiral Katz had many sea assignments during his Naval career: He was gunnery assistant, first lieutenant and ASW officer aboard the *USS Perry (DD 844)*. After attending Destroyer School, he returned the USS Perry as weapons officer and ASW Officer. He was Executive Officer aboard the *USS Mahan (DDG 42)* and then served as surface officer on the staff of Commander Cruiser-Destroyer Group Two. He commanded the destroyer USS Devo (DD 989) from 1983 to 1985. From 1987 to 1989 he commanded the *USS New Jersey (BB 62)*. In 1990 he was named Commander of Cruiser-Destroyer Group Two.

He later commanded the *America Battle Group* during *Operation Desert Storm*. He was then redeployed aboard the *USS America (CVA 66)*. Seven months later, as Commander of the Desert Storm Battle Group, he was the first commander to return to the Gulf after the war.

Vice Admiral Katz served as shipboard advisor with the Fleet Command Advisory Unit in Viet Nam. After a number of assignments, he was promoted to Vice Admiral in October 1992. He became Commander of the Naval Surface Force U.S. Atlantic Fleet in September 1994. He retired from active duty on August 1, 1997.
