PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Greetings Shipmates, I hope this finds you all well and enjoying our “wonderful” winter weather after the holidays with family and friends.

What a terrific reunion we had in San Antonio! The hotel on the Riverwalk was especially wonderful as we ventured out to superb eateries every evening and enjoyed such attractions as the lighted horse drawn carriages and the Alamo. We had a great time together on the 7th floor in the hospitality area telling sea stories (some almost true), eating too much and attending the opening night dinner/auction (Ray Kehoe and Randy Bergman presiding), which raised a fantastic amount for our scholarship program thanks to Dave Wasmer’s teak originals and some wonderful donations from our fellow shipmates! We also had a memorable memorial service honoring our fallen shipmates and final gala dinner.

Our trip to the Pacific War Museum turned out to be a great venue in Fredericksburg, home of FADM Nimitz. And who would have thought we would meet up with a docent (Bob Liam) who was the 4th commissioning Turret 2 Officer! We were also able to watch a particularly moving burial ceremony at the Fort Sam Houston National Cemetery. The reunion also attracted numerous other shipmates who live in the San Antonio area who stopped by and enjoyed their time with us.

This year we will celebrate in Paul Robbins’ (our 100-year-old plank owner) hometown of Omaha! What’s in Omaha you ask? The Union Pacific Train Museum, the SAC Aerospace Museum, the new Vietnam Memorial, the Omaha Memorial Park, the best American Zoo voted 2 years running with an arboretum adjacent to the zoo, the magnificent Joslyn Art Gallery, the Old Market part of town and Boys Town. We have already planned numerous events in and around Omaha so start your travel planning now. The Marriott Regency is under contract (make sure you mention the USS NEW JERSEY Vets when making reservations) to get the special rate of \$119/night (plus tax). **JOIN US!**

During the General Business Meeting we covered a variety of topics including the status of the ship improvements (the teak decking being almost complete), preparations for the Navy’s 250th birthday, our volunteer week in April 25 where we chipped out and repainted the inside of Turret 1 and future volunteer activities, we are planning to participate in aboard our ship.

Several major areas covered were how to increase our membership rolls and the location of future reunions. After a great deal of discussion and reviewing the actual data from the last 14 years of reunions, we voted to return to the ship in 2027 and 2028 (for elections) for the reunions after Omaha. Members also approved returning to the ship on an every other year basis, vice every 4 years, to encourage maximum participation as shipboard reunions draw the largest crowds by far. We also tasked our shipmates with bringing in more of the thousands of the 80’s shipmates into the organization. This change will also allow the submarine NEW JERSEY crew to more easily participate in being on the East Coast in Norfolk. We are already looking for new venues in the Philadelphia area while there, the possibility of our reunion dinner catered aboard the ship and having a volunteer workday with a meet the “sailors who served day” during our time aboard. The Board also approved funding and funded \$1250 of the remaining \$2500

already raised by shipmate donations to have the USS NEW JERSEY Veterans Inc. identified as a sponsor at the Surface Navy Museum in San Pedro CA. It will list our organization below the silhouette of the IOWA Class battleships.

The Navy 250th Birthday was a spectacular event with the USS BILLINGS (LCS-15) tied up alongside the Big J and many of our shipmates from WW2, Korea, Vietnam and Lebanon/Persian Gulf periods attending and providing personal accounts of their time aboard to the hundreds of daily visitors. The stern plate of the carrier USS ENTREPRISE (CV-6) was also unveiled at the ship with Paul Robbins and an original construction Rosie the Riveter present.

Paul and Jack Robbins were a highlight, meeting the CNO and presenting him with Paul's personal challenge coin. We also met with Congresswoman Sherrill (newly elected Governor of NJ) and over 100 Naval dignitaries celebrating our Navy's birthday. Our shipmates provided personal tours of the ship to sailors from ARLINGTON, LASSEN, COOPERSTOWN and BILLINGS who in turn provided us with personal tours of the BILLINGS. We forged a great relationship with their crews, and the BILLINGS Captain told me they felt a part of the Battleship and its traditions after spending a week with us. We presented the crew with teak decking for their Wardroom, Chief's Mess and Crew Mess. We were able to get staterooms aboard for our shipmate volunteers to reduce travel costs as well.

We now have an office for the USS NEW JERSEY Veterans Inc. aboard the Big J. Stateroom 0120 was cleaned and prepared for our use during reunions and volunteer work periods. Thanks to Bruce Whitman for helping me clean it all up! We are working on a brochure for the organization and intend on having brochures and membership applications aboard our ship year-round.

Our BIG challenge this year is to find our shipmates who are not currently members and offer them the opportunity to join and become more involved with our ship and organization. **Accept the challenge!** Reach out on social media, by phone or email and highlight how our organization supports the ship, its maintenance/updates and our scholarship program for former crewmember family members. Our monetary and political support of **OUR** ship on the waterfront in Camden is critical. Let's work on bringing them into the association to add expanded support to this organization and the Battleship!

Membership Chairman's Message



Greetings fellow shipmates and friends,

Elaine and I hope that all our shipmates had a great holiday season. We had a houseful of kids and grandchildren over Christmas. My youngest granddaughter saw a pile of envelopes sitting on my desk and wanted to know why there were so many.

I told her that I was the Membership Chairman of the USS New Jersey Veterans and I had to send out a second notice for 2026 dues renewals because people didn't mail the first request back right away. She then asked me "what are dues?".

I first had to explain what the USS New Jersey Veterans organization was. I told her that the USS New Jersey Veterans started as a group of USS New Jersey sailors that decided they would like to keep in touch with all the friends that they made while stationed on the ship and have a reunion. I then had to explain what a reunion was.

They put ads in magazines, mailed letters or called to all their shipmate friends that they kept in touch with and had the first reunion in 1982 in Long Beach, California. Russell Brown was the first president. Since the communication in 1980 was very limited by today's standards, no internet, no email and no cell phones, Russell Brown set up in his home a new communication technology, a dial-up bulletin board service, BBS for short. That's how I first found out about the USS New Jersey Veterans.

The USS New Jersey Veterans now also includes what are called "Associate Members". They usually fall into one of three categories.

- The family of USS New Jersey Veterans that loved their sailor who passed away, and who loved the New Jersey and the time that they spent aboard her, and want to keep their loved one's memory alive.
- Volunteers of the USS New Jersey Museum and Memorial. They are the ones that give their time and labor to the ship. I had no idea how many there are and how much time they put in to support our ship.
- There are some that just love the ship for what she accomplished and stood for.

Getting back to the dues.

We ask our members to pay dues every year for a number of reasons.

- Setting up and holding our reunions.
- Our annual donation to the USS New Jersey Museum and Memorial special projects such as new teakwood decking.
- The USS New Jersey Veterans Scholarship Fund. We award to three outstanding and deserving high school graduates a one thousand dollar scholarship.

I told my granddaughter that if she studied hard and was of good character, she would have a chance of receiving a scholarship, too.

Surface Warfare Specialist

To tell you the truth, until I took this job, I didn’t either.

Requirements For Enlisted Warfare Specialist Designation

Learning Objective: Recall the requirements for enlisted warfare specialist designations. The purpose of the enlisted warfare specialist designation is to recognize through a formal qualification program, exceptional achievement, initiative and professional qualifications of enlisted personnel. To qualify as an enlisted warfare specialist, you must complete a qualification program that is part of the personnel qualification standards (PQS). The qualification program consists of general knowledge requirements of the overall mission, engineering capabilities, combat systems and other mission-essential systems, and basic equipment involved in the particular warfare specialty.

TREASURER'S REPORT



It's a new year and I hope everyone is doing well and making it through the winter.

Accompanying this report is a copy of the financials for 2025. We ended 2025 with \$48,974 in funds on hand which was an increase of \$85 over 2024 year-end balances.

Total revenues for the year were \$39,230 with Reunion Receipts comprising 48% of those monies, Membership Dues 19%, Scholarship Fund Auction and Donations 14%, Ship Restoration Donations 7%, 50/50 Tickets Sales 6% and Ship's Store Sales 5%.

Disbursements totaled \$39,145 with Reunion Expenses comprising 49% of funds disbursed, Bounce Expenses 23% and Scholarship Awards and Ship Restoration Funds forwarded to the Battleship 15%. The Organization also contributed \$1,000 to the Pacific Battleship Center to fund a plaque recognizing the USS New Jersey's contributions and exploits.

I would welcome any questions members might have regarding the financial information provided.

We look forward to seeing everyone in Omaha this September.

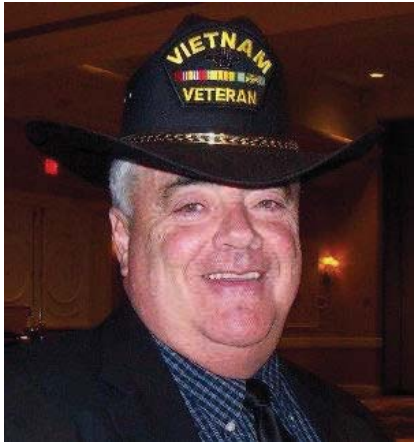

Shipmate Reflections

Robert Fahrenholz

As told to Wayne Greenleaf

USS New Jersey, August 1944 - May 1946

"I must be in New Brunswick" Robert Fahrenholz said to his mom on June 5, 1926....well, being only five hours old, maybe he just thought it... But a few days later, he was comfortably nestled in his home in Milltown, NJ, ready to take on the world.

As he grew up, along with his brother and two sisters, he spent many happy hours exploring and playing in the woods around his home with his pack of neighborhood boys. As he grew older, he was enrolled in vocational school, where he studied electricity, always with the thought in the back of his mind of one day becoming a sailor.

That day came when he was 17, finding himself enlisting and heading to boot camp in Sampson, New York. After 10 weeks, he shipped out to school in Bainbridge, MD then Shoemaker, CA. His first tour was on LST 610, for a short period before being ordered to the *USS New Jersey* in August 1944. After meeting the ship in Hawaii, Bob and the *New Jersey* headed for the Western Pacific and the most devastating and cataclysmic war in human history.

Soon after arrival in WESTPAC, The *New Jersey* would find itself fighting a different "war." in December 1944, the Third Fleet, with Admiral William "Bull" Halsey commanding, aboard his flagship *USS New Jersey*, with QMSN Bob Fahrenholz up in Navigation, sailed into the massive Typhoon Cobra ("Halsey's Typhoon"). The event remains the US Navy's deadliest natural disaster.

170 ships were caught in 150 mph winds and 90-foot waves east of Luzon. The storm sank three destroyers – the Hull, Monaghan, and Spence. 790 sailors were killed, and nearly 900 were swept overboard. 27 ships sustained damage and 146 aircraft were destroyed or washed overboard. Fires broke out on several aircraft carriers.

Damage to the fleet was severe. Some ships rolled more than 70°. The carrier *Monterey* was nearly taken down in flames by its own airplanes as they crashed into bulkheads and exploded during violent rolls. One of those fighting the fires aboard *Monterey* was LT Gerald Ford, our 38th President. Ford later recalled nearly going overboard when the ship rolled 20°.

Bob remembers that several ships attempted to refuel from the *New Jersey*, but all were unsuccessful due to heavy rolling, including the *USS Spence*: her rudder jammed and she capsized and sank drowning 317 men, after hoses parted while attempting to refuel from *New Jersey* - due, in part, to their disobeying direct orders from Admiral Halsey to

ballast down. The fuel tanks had to be de-ballasted to accept needed fuel, so the ship had insufficient fuel to weather the storm. This was a problem shared by the destroyers and destroyer escorts. Bob remembers that the *New Jersey* itself suffered significant damage to its forward 20mm guns. During the rough weather, he found Admiral Halsey pacing up and down in the passageway outside of his stateroom.

Throughout the war, Bob continued his duties in the chart house, working on the ship's charts and keeping records, and on the bridge working as helmsman, soon making QM3.

When the typhoon was over, and victory had been won in the war, Bob returned home. He found Claire, the love of his life, at a dance, and wasted no time (six months) marrying her. He went to work at Squibb, in New Brunswick, working there for 12 years. It was at that time that he found his life's work, managing a local nonprofit cemetery, 125 acres in size, in nearby Scotch Plains. He did that for 40 years. and then turned the job over to his son. Along the way, Bob had five children - four daughters and a son. Today, at 99 ½, his love affair with Claire (97) continues: they will be celebrating their 78th wedding anniversary this August...!

Bob often relives his many memories of his Navy years....but despite his experiences in the war and the typhoon, he is sure he would do it all again. And his secret for a long life...? "Don't worry - it all falls into place. And a glass of wine with dinner doesn't hurt either...!"

Thanks for the memories, Bob.



State of the Museum Report

Shipmates,

2024 might have been the year we drydocked the battleship but 2025 is the year that we secured the museum's relevance. Participating in the Navy and Marine Corps' 250th birthday celebrations brought increased visitation, especially from the Navy's decision makers who all got to see the great condition that the ship is in after the last several years of intentional efforts. The acquisition of key artifacts improves our ability to tell our story to future visitors. And on top of that, the President announced a new class of modern battleships that he wants to build. The limited information available now has positioned our museum as to be a part of the conversation of what exactly is a battleship in the 21st century and what is its role.

This year the museum had eight semesters of intern help. These interns learned the basics of giving tours and how museums work but spent most of their time working with our collection. For the first time in the museum's history the blueprint collection is now usable for research both by the museum and by outside parties. The object collection was catalogued in its entirety; this has allowed for the significant uptick in exhibit creation. The archives collection is next on the list for the 2026 intern class. They catalogued 6,579 Objects and 6,778 Blueprints.

We continue to lead the field in our social media presence. In 2025 we had over 194 million YouTube Views. We reach 279,000 subscribers and 1,900 videos.

In 2025 we had 57 new collections of objects donated to the museum totaling 627 items. Some notable objects include the 7 new .50 caliber machine guns, an original 16in powder bag, one of the ship's original 1911 handguns, an RPV Pioneer Drone, and the stern plate of the aircraft carrier ENTERPRISE (CV-6).

This was a banner year for new exhibits at the museum. The museum has only opened 3 exhibits in the previous 6 years however in 2025 we unveiled 6 representing a major if still incomplete overhaul of the exhibits of the ship. They are Leyte Gulf Recognition Models, Support Any Friend, Commodore Barry, Enterprise and Pier Signage, Lebanon, and MARDET.

This year the museum acquired three 3-D Printers courtesy of a generous donor. These printers are being used for multiple purposes including producing items for the ship's

store which have been selling very well. Notably, these printers are also being used for the museum's interpretation. There is now a replica Harpoon Missile in the Captain's In-Port cabin, as there was during the last years of the ship's career. The museum has a photograph of the item from 1987 but not the original object itself.

By far the most impressive accomplishment this year is our record-breaking visitation numbers. I have records going back to 2013 and while I have seen articles online claiming 350,000 guests in 2002, I can't confirm the accuracy of that. What I can say is our numbers this year represent a modest increase over any previous year on record. 2024 we were closed several months for drydocking but compared to our last full year, 2023 we were slightly down with 50,429 self-guided guests, way up with 15,220 guests on guided tours, significantly down with 5,264 overnight campers, and level with 14,316 events participants for a total of 61,491 daytime guests and 81,071 total individuals who crossed our decks. We have not had over 80,000 guests in more than a decade.

As we move into 2026, we urgently need support to save unique and historically irreplaceable Iowa-class battleship blueprints, manuals, and spare parts from imminent destruction. In February, USS Charleston (LKA-113) will begin the scrapping process in Brownsville, TX. In her forward cargo holds are literal tons of objects and documents from Iowa-class battleships including long out-of-production spare parts and the complete engineering log office blueprints from USS New Jersey.

We need to raise at least \$35,000 to save three truckloads of irreplaceable documents and parts. For every approximately \$8,000 more we raise we will be able to recover another truck load. There's more than 20 semi trucks' worth of equipment and documents in her holds. Anything we can't bring back will be lost forever.

In 1999 when Missouri and New Jersey were being prepared to be transferred to their museums, the Navy removed hundreds of boxes of plans and parts to support the remaining Iowa's, which would be held in reserve for another decade. Eventually, those parts made it to USS Charleston in Philadelphia where they were consolidated with still more parts.

It is unlikely we will be able to find these parts anywhere else in the future. Some, like the original steam whistle, date back to World War II. Others, like the motors for air handlers, are critical for keeping our climate control system functioning. But the parts are a drop in the historic importance bucket compared to the blueprints and manuals. No complete set of Iowa-class blueprints exists. We believe the complete engineering log office plans for both Missouri and New Jersey are in boxes on Charleston.

Battleship New Jersey is working with other museum battleships to save these parts. Three other battleships joined us in tagging parts on Charleston for salvage in 2020. We will continue to work with them and other museum ships to make sure as much as possible makes it to one of our ships, then is made available for the others to use. This will include cataloging and scanning documents in the future.

In addition to the other museum ships, we have also worked with Naval Sea Systems Command and the National Archives. Both of those entities are limited in how much they can take in and how much access to the ship they can get us.

The federal government will not be saving anything else off this ship. It is all up to us now. With your help we can fly to Brownsville and save the last known stockpile of battleship parts and documents. In the immortal words of Indiana Jones, "It belongs in a museum!"

The Strategic Air Command & Aerospace (SAC) Museum focuses on aircraft and nuclear missiles of the United States Air Force during the Cold War. The objective of the museum is to preserve and display historic aircraft, missiles and space vehicles and provide educational resources.

The museum was established in 1959 and was originally located on the Offutt Air Force Base. In 1970, ownership of the museum was transferred from the Air Force to the State of Nebraska. On May 16, 1998, the museum moved indoors to the new facility in Ashland, Nebraska. After several name changes, the museum was officially changed its name to Strategic Air Command (SAC) & Aerospace Museum on June 25th, 2015.

The SAC Museum has over 40 aircraft, including famous bombers that are on display. There are iconic planes like the B-52, B-36, B-1A, alongside missiles and other aerospace vehicles.

This is a museum everyone will love. The museum has its own volunteers that do all the work to restore the aircraft. The complete restoration of an aircraft at the Museum takes, on average, two years and approximately 10,000 hours of labor. The EC-135 Looking Glass restoration took over 32,000 volunteer hours and about six years to complete.

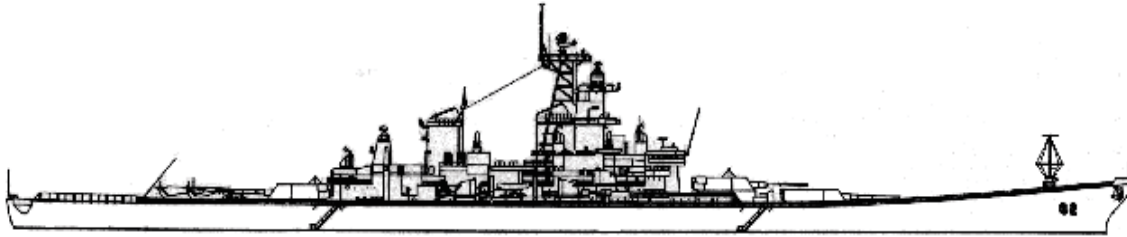


Freedom Park serves as a United States Naval Museum on the Missouri River. It is home to the USS Marlin SST-2 Submarine and the USS Hazard AM-240 Minesweeper, Anchor & Propeller Garden, Shipboard Rocket Launchers and a Douglas A-4D Skyhawk Jet Fighter and other aircraft.

The USS Hazard was commissioned October 31, 1944 and was very active during WWII. The ship's slogan was "No Sweep, No Invasion".

The USS Hazard was decommissioned in 1946 and is the only Admirable-Class minesweeper left in the United States.

This park is only open on Saturdays, however, one of the senior members of the volunteer groups will be our personal guide and opening the park specifically for the USS New Jersey Veterans.

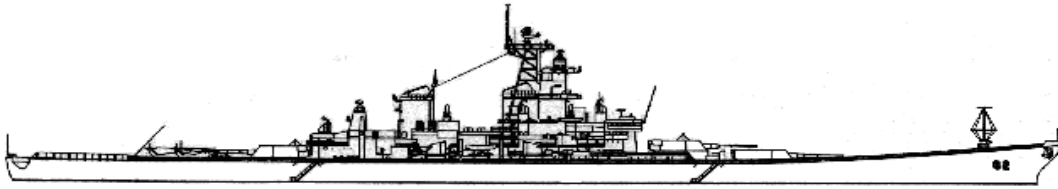

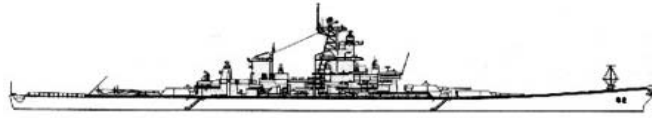

One of the scholarships is the Richard Esser Scholarship, presented in honor of a former President and outstanding shipmate. The winners will be selected by a committee appointed by the President. All applicants will be notified of their final status by the President.

A complete application must be submitted via US Mail and postmarked no later than June 1st

Eligibility Requirements:

1. Sponsor shall be a former or current crewmember of the USS NEW JERSEY and current member in good standing (dues shall be paid up-to-date) of the USS New Jersey Veterans, Inc.
2. Sponsor shall be a member in good standing of the USS New Jersey Veterans, Inc. for 24 months prior to the deadline date for submission of the application they are sponsoring.
3. A sponsor who is recently deceased shall be considered a member in good standing for the period of 12 months from their date of death subject to providing a copy of sponsors obituary.
4. Applicants shall be the descendant (child, grandchild, or great-grandchild) of a qualified sponsor. Stepchildren shall also qualify.
5. Applicants shall be entering their first year of college for undergraduate studies or trade school.
6. Scholarship funds will be paid directly to the university, college, or trade schools of the applicant.
7. Documentation and photos submitted will not be returned.
8. Descendants of the current Scholarship Committee members are not eligible.

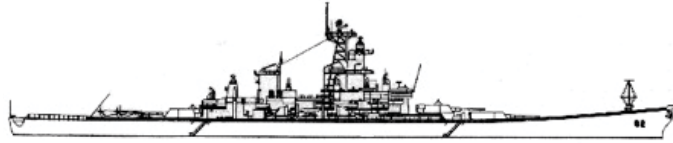

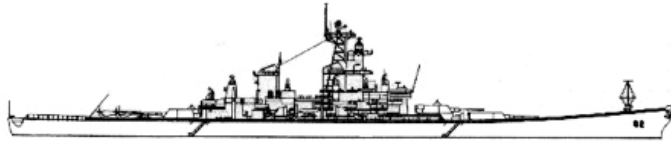
